Arkansas Food Bank provided an opportunity for DFA-U members to sharpen their leadership application skills, while lending a hand to help and learn more about the communities the Department serves daily. Volunteers from DFA-U alumni, current DFA-U candidates and mentors, and the leadership team joined together to put their teamwork, communication, and process improvement skills to the test!

How did it go? As might be expected, the small and mighty DFA team produced enormous results. Thirty-three members of DFA-U were divided at several working stations, to be instructed on their specific tasks in the process. The shared goal was to prepare a considerable amount of after school program snack packs accurately, and efficiently, within a three-hour window. The volunteers filled and sealed bags with food items, sorted the bags into boxes equally, and then sealed and stacked the boxes on pallets for delivery. Easy right? That's where individual skills are applied.

Each station had to quickly find a rhythm, a method for their high paced productivity. Did I mention that each group had strangers among them? While DFA employees serve the same audience, they don't always know all of the players behind the curtains across the DFA divisions. Each group quickly established order, developed a process, and implemented procedures to complete their assignments with their new team.

Servant events, such as volunteering at the local food bank, allow teams to develop, network, and build stronger bonds, especially during crunch time. DFA's mission to provide responsive, cost-effective and timely support services to Arkansas policymakers, public agencies, and state employees as they serve Arkansas's citizens is always in the forefront for the desired culture of the Department. That's why servant leadership has been a foundational aspect of the DFA University Leadership program. At the end of the morning the tally came in and the results proved success. DFA-U members packed enough bags during their three-hour event to feed 3165 kids, right here in Arkansas!

The Governor's Council on Developmental Disabilities (GCDD) is a federally funded, self-governing organization charged with identifying the most pressing needs of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities in our state. The Council promotes integration, inclusion, and independence for Arkansans with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). GCDD Director and DFA-U leadership team member, Jonathan Taylor leads the council to identify the most pressing needs of the IDD community in Arkansas and address those needs by conducting outreach, fostering change, and supporting capacity-building efforts.

The GCDD closed out the year by hosting the Arkansas Business Summit 2023, in Fayetteville, with its partners Arkansas Rehabilitation Services (ARS), Disability: IN Arkansas, and Arkansas Chapter of the Association of People Supporting Employment First Arkansas (APSE). The theme, *Top Floor to the Front Door* addressed the common disconnect many companies face when executing Disability Accessibility and Inclusion policies. The message was designed to assist attendees with breaking down barriers between supervisors and employees with disabilities, who are entering the workforce.

Top Floor to the Front Door offered real-world stories, skills, and strategies for business and service providers who want to hire people with disabilities. DFA Human Resources Recruiter, Courtney Brown, attended the event to learn practical advice on how to build relationships as well as how to recruit and manage employees with disabilities and mental health conditions.
